JONES FALLS TRAIL green map

The Jones Falls Trail will be a ten-mile long hiking and biking trail connecting the Inner Harbor to Mount Washington, and perhaps eventually to Robert L. Lee Park in Baltimore County. Currently 4.25 miles long, the Trail runs from Woodberry light rail station, through Clippert Hill, winding 2.75 miles through Druid Hill Park, crossing Wyman Park Bridge over the Jones Falls River, switching back down the hill to Falls Road, heading south, it parallels the river, passing Rowland Hall and the Baltimore Streetcar Museum before arriving at Penn Station. A 1.1 mile spur will extend along Western Run in Mt. Washington.

This map covers the Baltimore City portion of the Jones Falls Watershed. All the land within this area drains toward the Jones Falls River, then into the Inner Harbor and out to the Chesapeake Bay. Find out more about the watershed on the other side of this map. Think of the Trail as the spine to access green recreation, commerce, culture, and sustainable lifestyle activities in the Lower Jones Falls Valley.
