Figure 3b: State Shares of Own Sectoral Employment Relative to February 2019 Trade, Transportation and Utilities




Figure 3c: State Shares of Own Sectoral Employment Relative to February 2019 Professional and Business Services




Figure 3d: State Shares of Own Sectoral Employment Relative to February 2019 Health and Education





Figure 4c: Percentage Point Recovery from April 2020 Relative to February 2019 Own Sectoral Employment Professional and Business Services




Figure 9: Percentage Point Recovery Against Vaccination Rate
