CHARLES A. PEPLE

CHARLES A. PEPLE was born at Richmond, Va., April 17, 1867. Later his family moved to Manchester (now South Richmond), where he attended the public schools. Afterwards he attended the school of John P. McGuire in Richmond, and in 1882 became a student at the Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, Blacksburg, Va. (now Virginia Polytechnic Institute), from which he was graduated in 1884. Soon after graduating he obtained a clerical position with the State Bank of Virginia (Richmond), with which institution he remained about twenty years in various capacities.

Mr. Peple has been connected with a number of banking institutions as an officer or director, among which are The Bank of Commerce and The Central National Bank. He is a Certified Public Accountant of Virginia, and held the position of Resident Manager at Richmond, Va. (and later that of Resident Vice-President) of the American Audit Company of New York.

In July, 1915, he became Deputy Governor of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, Va., which position he now occupies.
