SCHOOLS – FACILITIES CHALLENGE

Patterson Park Public Charter School

- \$13M acquisition and rehab; tax exempt and taxable; 6% fixed; 35 years; debt service \$1446 per pupil

City Neighbors Charter School

- 2.5 million renovations of Church owned facility.

Baltimore Curriculum Project

- City Springs, \$197,000 rent to district; \$320 per pupil

AFYA Public Charter and Green School

- \$4.5 M; 6%; \$850 per pupil

City Neighbors Hamilton Campus

- 8.5 M Bond financing through MHEFA

Midtown

- \$65,000 rent to Archdiocese; \$361 per pupil

Coppin/Rosemont

- \$200,000 rent to district; \$445 per pupil
