







Cost Comparison




Multiple Studies Show that Permanent Supportive Housing Reduces Costs


COST SAVINGS OF PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

Models for Collaboration



- Best Practices Nationwide
 - Hospitals use **Vulnerability Index (VI)** during intake assessments
 - **Discharge policies** that cover patients who lack stable settings
 - Communitywide or regional **medical respite/recuperation program**
 - Frequent users prioritized for permanent supportive housing

Social Impact Bonds?

- Current State

- No funds for preventative care (permanent supportive housing)
- Expensive use of hospitals and jails

- Ideal State

- Funds for preventative care (permanent supportive housing)
- Reduced cost to hospitals and jails
- Use savings to fund prevention (permanent supportive housing)




