

Overview of Northern Virginia WIOA Youth Program

- Northern Virginia WIOA Youth Program is one of the largest in Virginia.
- 267 young adults participating (as of March 2016).
 - 63% of participants are Out Of School
 - 76% are Basic Skills Deficient
 - 47% have a documented disability
 - 15% engaged with juvenile justice system
 - 6% in foster care
- Northern Virginia Team Independence Initiative (PFS) will create new mobile unit, meeting young adults at non-traditional locations.
 - Serving 30-40 foster care and adjudicated young adults in Year One.
 - Goal: exceed WIOA Youth Program Measures for this population.

Pay For Success and Northern Virginia WIOA Youth Program

- ***SkillSource*** will contract with ICF, International to establish data baselines and counterfactuals.
- For every young person who ‘ages out’ of foster care, taxpayers pay approximately \$300,000 over that young person’s lifetime.*
 - public assistance, incarceration, and lost wage costs,
 - potential savings if these youth are re-directed to education, training, and gainful employment.

Pay For Success and Northern Virginia WIOA Youth Program

- Explore the range of potential government end payers and their outcomes of interest as tied to cost savings.
 - Decreased caseload and shorter lengths of stay:
 - TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families)
 - SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
 - Virginia Department of Medical Assistance
 - Virginia Department of Corrections
