A quarter is worth 25 cents. This value can also be written as 25¢ or \$.25. It is equivalent to 25 pennies or 5 nickels.

What is on the Back of the Coin?

Traditionally, the bald eagle is on the reverse side of the quarter, however, from 1999 through 2008, the U.S. Mint released five new state quarters each year with a unique design from each state on the back. In 2009, quarters were issued with the reverse sides honoring the District of Columbia and six U.S. territories. From 2010 - 2021, the America the Beautiful Quarter program will issue 56 quarters featuring the reverse sides designs depicting national parks and other national sites from all 50 states, the District of Columbia and U.S. Territories.
