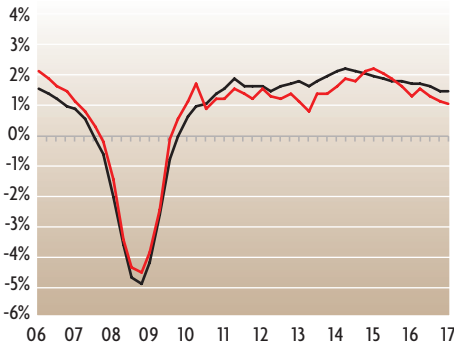

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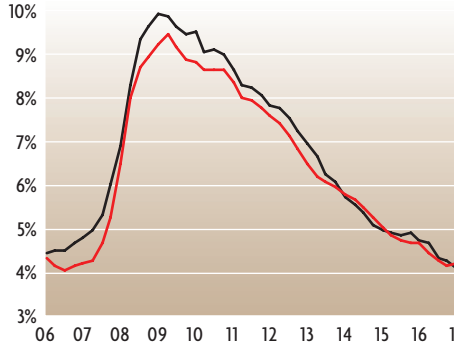
### Nonfarm Employment

Fourth Quarter 2006 – Fourth Quarter 2017



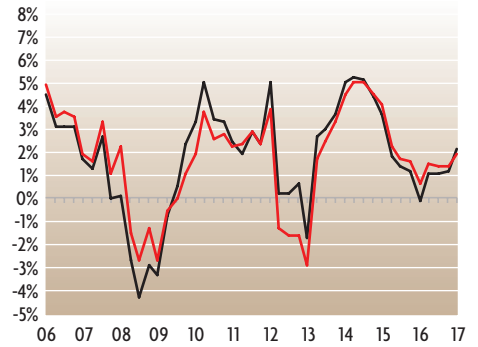
### Unemployment Rate

### Real Personal Income

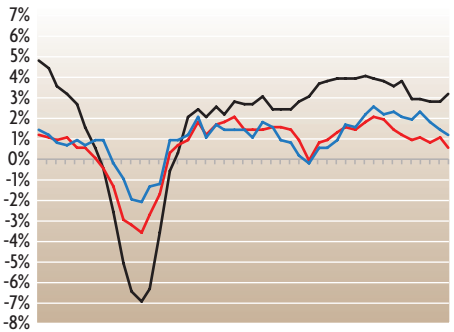

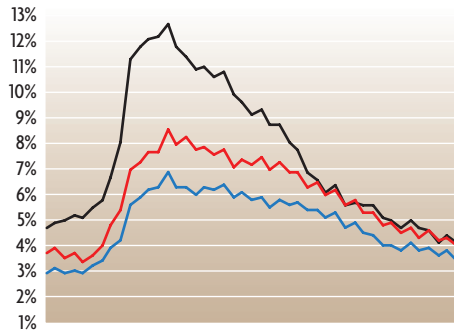
### Nonfarm Employment Major Metro Areas

Fourth Quarter 2006 – Fourth Quarter 2017



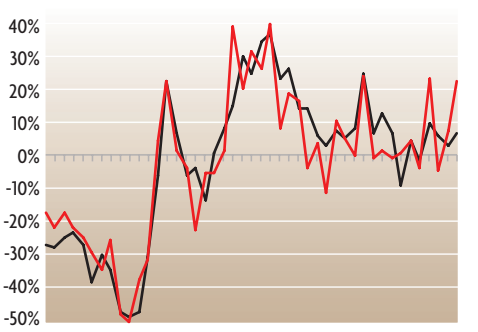
### Unemployment Rate Major Metro Areas

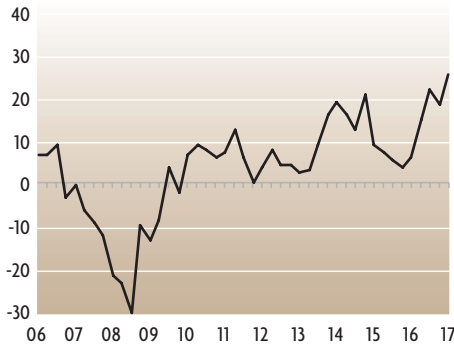

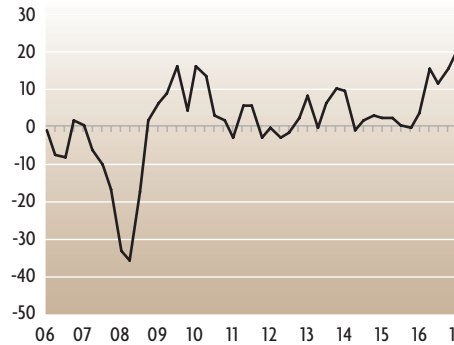
### FRB—Richmond Services Revenues Index

Fourth Quarter 2006 – Fourth Quarter 2017



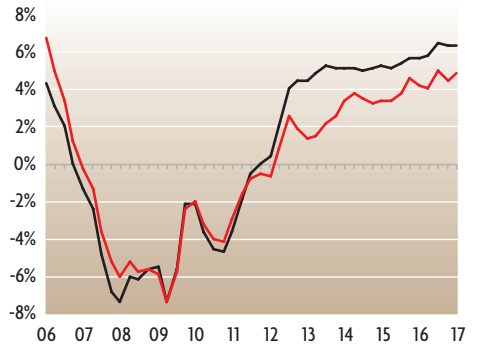
### FRB—Richmond Manufacturing Composite Index
